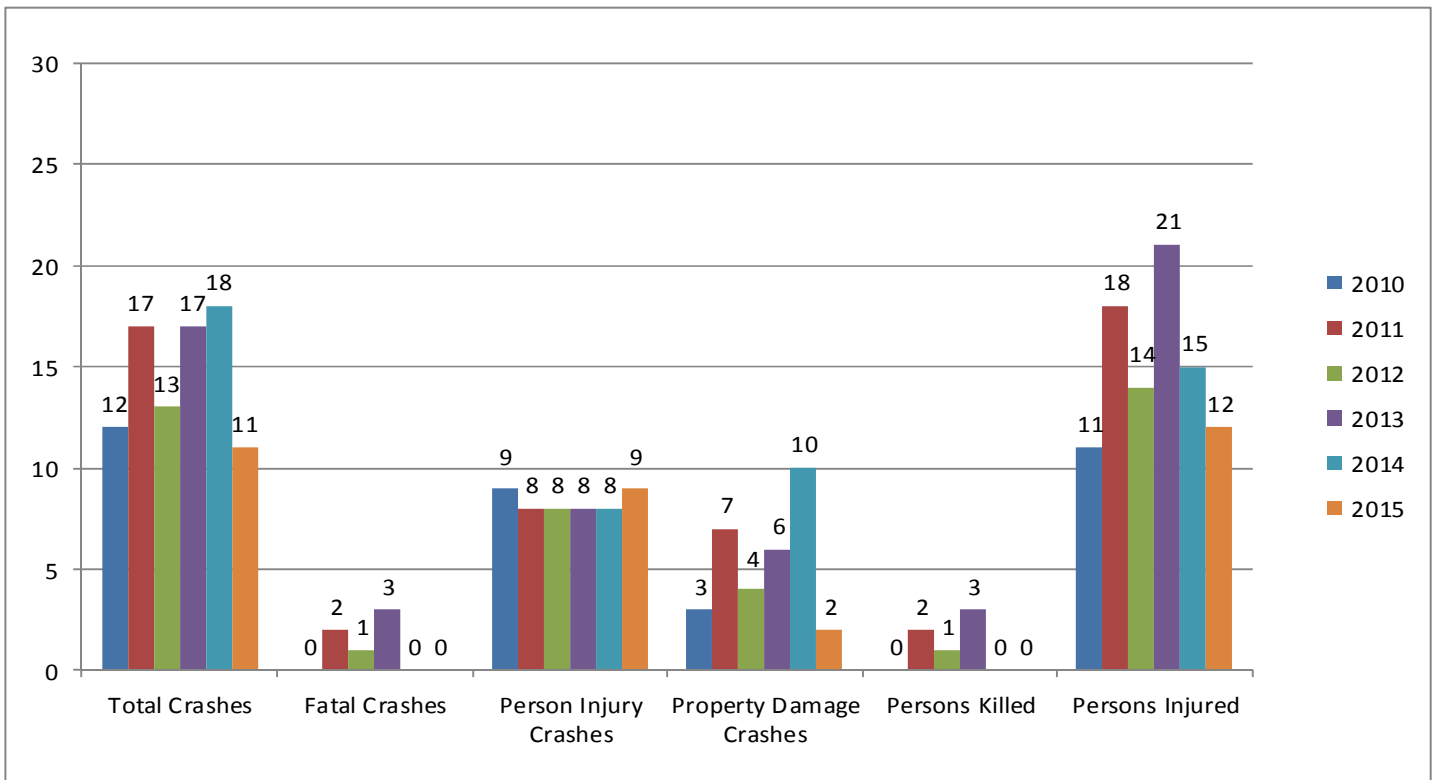


DRUG INVOLVED TRAFFIC CRASHES

After alcohol, marijuana is the drug most often found in the blood of drivers involved in crashes. Several studies have shown that drivers with THC in their blood were roughly twice as likely to be responsible for a deadly crash or be killed than drivers who hadn't used drugs. Along with marijuana, prescription drugs are also commonly linked to drugged driving crashes.

The chart below shows the largest decline in total crashes in five years. The majority of the crashes caused property and personal injury but none were fatal.
