



Calhoun County Opioid Overdose Deaths

Total opioid-related deaths in Calhoun County residents has increased each year since 2013. In 2019, there was 42 deaths, 52 in 2020, and 59 in 2021. This is a 13.3% increase in opioid deaths from 2020 to 2021 alone.



Of the opioid deaths, 23 years old was the minimum age, 45 years old was the average, and 81 years old was the oldest.





28% had been to a treatment clinic/detox center at least free in the one time.

33% reported they were substance

11% received medication for opioid misuse in the past 3 weeks. past 2 years.



Of the opioid deaths, 41% had Naloxone (NARCAN®) administered to them. Who administered the Naloxone? 15 were from EMS, 2 from the Hospital, 1 from a bystander, and the rest were a combination of all
